

This guide reflects the New Core Curriculum effective Fall 2017. Transfer students starting at Detroit Mercy between Fall 2017 and Summer 2021 will have the option to select this New Core or the Old Core. See Transfer Guides indicating “OLD CORE” for prior Core requirements.

The following courses will transfer into Detroit Mercy’s Social Work program. Students may transfer a maximum of 63 credits toward a Bachelor’s Degree; course grades must be a C or better. If admitted under the WCCCD-University Center **part-time** Social Work Articulation Agreement, students may transfer an additional 19 credits for a total of 82 transferrable credits. Additional courses not on this guide may also transfer.
